LÂNGHOLMEN FC WAS FORMED by a bunch of ex- pats who met up on the gravel pitch on the island of Långholmen for a kick about every weekend. In 2002 it was decided that they would create a team and enter the Korpen league (about the same standard as Sunday league) and after a victorious first season they decided in 2003 to enter into the Stockholm league system with a division 8 team, winning promotion



to div 7 at their first attempt. 2004 saw them finish a respectable 5th place in the table. The following years saw great success for the club and by 2008 the first team found themselves in division 4. At the half way point in the season the Långholmen team were threatened with relegation, but a marvellous second half saw them finish in 9th place and secure their div 4 status. 2009 was the best year so far in the clubs history with the senior team winning div 4 and with it promotion to the national league system, a superb achievement for a small amateur club with no youth set up. The future looks bright for Långholmen FC with no less than 7 teams now competing in the black and white stripes plus a growing fan base. If the club continues to advance as they have, Långholmen should be up there competing with the big boys pretty soon.
